TEENAGE PREGNANCY LOCAL IMPLEMENTATION GRANT: 2008-09, 2009-10 & 2010-11

Summary and Background

1. The Teenage Pregnancy Local Implementation Grant will continue for a further three years. This circular sets out the purpose of the grant and grant allocations for 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2010-11.
2. The purpose of the funding is to support the implementation and coordination of local teenage pregnancy strategies to meet local 2010 under 18 conception rate reduction targets and to improve outcomes for teenage parents and their children. Local action plans should reflect the Department for Education and Skills and Department of Health planning guidance *Teenage Pregnancy Next Steps: Guidance for Local Authorities and Primary Care Trusts on Effective Delivery of Local Strategies* (July 2006) and the Department for Children, Schools and Families and the Department of Health planning guidance *Teenage Parents Next Steps: Guidance for Local Authorities and Primary Care Trusts* (July 2007). Action plans of the local Teenage Pregnancy Strategy should be integrated into the Children and Young People's Plan and Targeted Youth Support arrangements.
3. Launched by the Prime Minister in 1999, the Teenage Pregnancy Strategy aims to reduce the under 18 conception rate by 50% by 2010 as part of a broader strategy to improve sexual health; and to increase the proportion of mothers aged 16-19 in education, training or employment to 60% by 2010, to reduce their risk of long term social exclusion. Achievement of local targets underpins delivery of the national 50% reduction.

Grant Allocations

4. The Teenage Pregnancy grant will be non-ringfenced and paid through the Area Based Grant, which will be administered by the Department for Communities and Local Government. The level of financial provision for the Teenage Pregnancy Grant remains the same as that for 2007-08. Annex A sets out the grant allocations for each authority for 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2010-11. Allocations are based on a formula that reflects the under 18 conception rates and population sizes and the reduction in under 18 conception numbers that an area must achieve to reach their 2010 target. These vary between a 40% and a 60% reduction with higher rate areas having a more challenging target.
