## VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS IN THE UK: 2006/07

### INTRODUCTION

This Statistical First Release (SFR) updates the information presented in the Statistical First Release 'Vocational Qualifications in the UK: 2005/06', SFR 05/2007, published on 22 February 2007.

Unlike in previous years this SFR concentrates purely on the achievement of accredited vocational qualifications. Information on Level 2 and 3 attainment by young people in England is also published by the Department on 26 February 2008 as a separate SFR and is available via the following link: (<http://www.dfes.gov.uk/rsgateway/DB/SFR/s000774/index.shtml>) and information on the highest level of qualification held by adults in England will be published on 28 February 2008 and will be available via the following link: (<http://www.dfes.gov.uk/rsgateway/DB/SFR/s000777/index.shtml>).

Information on awards of National Vocational Qualifications (NVQs), Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), and Vocationally Related Qualifications (VRQs) is taken from the National Information System for Vocational Qualifications (NISVQ) held by DCSF and from information supplied by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA).

### KEY POINTS

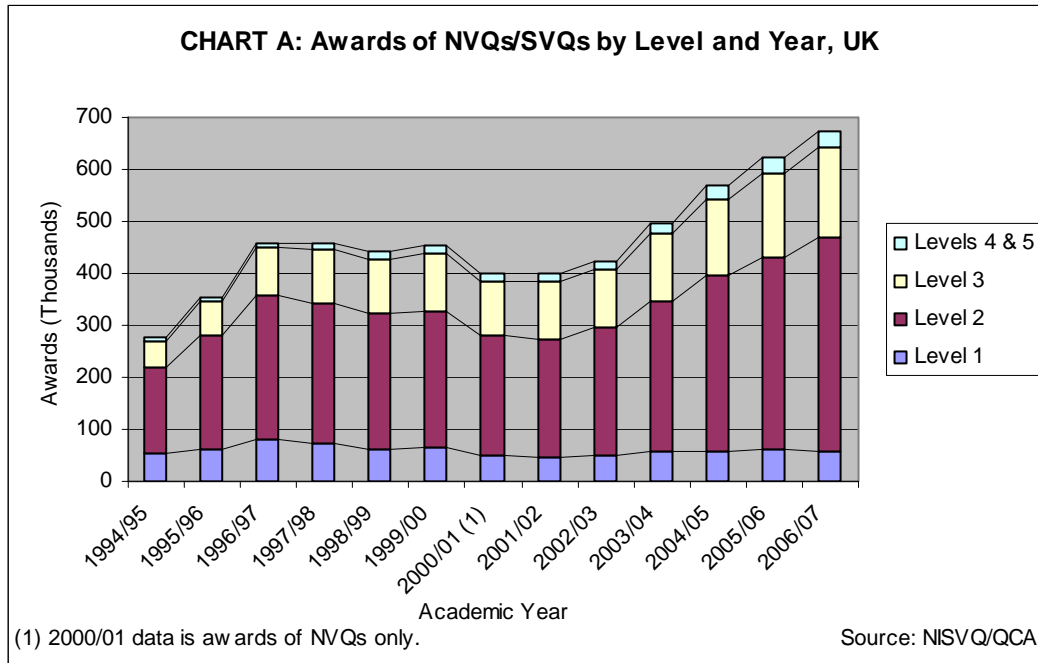
- The number of NVQs/SVQs awarded in the UK has risen again to 673 thousand in 2006/07, an increase of 8% when compared to 2005/06, following an increase of 9% between 2004/05 and 2005/06 (Table 1).
- 55% of all NVQ/SVQ awards in the UK go to people aged 25 and over (Table 4), unchanged from 2005/06.
- Vocationally Related Qualifications (VRQs) are becoming increasingly important. 1.4 million VRQ awards were reported to NISVQ in 2006/07, although this only represents a little over 60% of all VRQ awards in the year (Table 6), compared with 1.2 million awards reported to NISVQ last year, representing a little under 60% of VRQs awarded.
- Almost 296 thousand of these awards were full VRQs (where Guided Learning Hours were at least 80% of hours recommended), around 21% of the total. Of these, 157 thousand were at Level 2 and 99 thousand at Level 3 (Table 6).

### AWARDS OF NVQs/SVQs, UK (See Tables 1 to 5)

#### NVQ/SVQ Awards Over Time (See Table 1 and Chart A below)

Between their introduction in 1987 and the end of September 2007, 6.8 million NVQs/SVQs have been awarded in the UK. The number of NVQs/SVQs awarded has increased from 622 thousand in 2005/06 to 673 thousand in 2006/07 – an

increase of 8%, compared with increases of 17% between 2002/03 and 2003/04, 14% between 2003/04 and 2004/05 and 9% between 2004/05 and 2005/06.



#### 2006/07 NVQ/SVQ Awards by Academic Age, Level and Gender (See Table 4)

Over half of all NVQ/SVQ awards go to people aged 25 and over. In 2006/07, 373 thousand NVQs/SVQs awards (55%) were made to people aged 25 and over, 25% were to people aged over 40, the same proportions as last year.

The higher the NVQ/SVQ level, the more likely it has been awarded to a learner from the older age group – 31% of level 1s (down from 36% last year), 55% of level 2s (up from 54% last year), 57% of level 3s (down from 58% last year) and 89% of level 4/5s (up from 88% last year) went to the 25 and over age group.

More women get NVQ/SVQs than men – this is particularly true for higher levels – for example at level 3, 62% of awards were to women, a similar proportion to last year.

#### 2006/07 NVQ/SVQ Awards by Centre Type (See Table 4)

For NVQ/SVQs, Further Education/Tertiary Colleges and Private Training Providers continue to dominate – 40% of all NVQ/SVQs awarded were made through Further Education Colleges (42% in 2005/06) and 39% through Private Training Providers (the same as 2005/06).

It should be noted that both FE colleges and training providers frequently provide assessment and certification services to employers where candidates are based.

#### 2006/07 NVQ/SVQ Awards by Sector Subject Area (See Table 5)

23% of all NVQ/SVQ awards were in 'Health, Public Services & Care' (the same as last year) – with as many as 33% of all level 3 NVQ/SVQs in this sector subject area (up from 31% in 2005/06). The next most important subject areas were 'Retail & Commercial Enterprise' (20% of all awards – again the same as last year) and 'Business Administration & Law' (16% of all awards – 17% last year).

There are big differences between men and women in sector subject areas. In 'Health, Public Services & Care' there were 133 thousand awards made to women compared to 24 thousand for men; in 'Engineering & Manufacturing Technologies' 82 thousand awards to men and 9 thousand to women and in 'Construction, Planning & the Built Environment' 74 thousand awards were made to men and a negligible amount to women.

### **People holding NVQs/SVQs**

The Quarter 4 2007 Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimated that 5.2 million people held an NVQ/SVQ - irrespective of the year awarded. Of these 57% were female - the same as in Quarter 4 2006. A further 506 thousand people, who did not hold a full NVQ/SVQ, held one or more NVQ/SVQ units.

### **People working towards NVQs/SVQs**

According to the LFS in Quarter 4 2007 there were 920 thousand people working towards an NVQ/SVQ, a negligible decrease of 7 thousand from Quarter 4 2006. Of these only 206 thousand people (22%) were full-time students, an increase from 21% in Quarter 4 2006. 61% of those working towards an NVQ/SVQ did not already have one.

## **AWARDS OF VOCATIONALLY RELATED QUALIFICATIONS (VRQs), UK (See Tables 6 and 7)**

In 2006/07, NISVQ collected and processed information on awards of Vocationally Related Qualifications from 47 awarding bodies, compared to 45 last year. Therefore, the numbers in the tables and quoted in the text do not cover all VRQ awards – and need to be treated with some care. Analyses of VRQ awards in this SFR relate only to awards made by these 47 awarding bodies and are not complete UK estimates. Many of the awards presented here are not considered to be full VRQ awards (ie full = width of 80-100%).

### **2006/07 VRQ Awards by Age, Level and Gender (See Table 6)**

44% of all the recorded VRQ awards in 2006/07 were to people aged 25 and over, compared to just under half last year, with 19% to people aged over 40 (22% in 2005/06). Awards of full VRQs,<sup>1</sup> account for 21% of all recorded VRQs; about 30% of these have been achieved by those aged 16 and under.

As in earlier years, in 2006/07 more men than women achieved a VRQ – unlike NVQs, men are more likely to get a VRQ at all levels than women – for example, at both levels 2 and 3 53% of all VRQ awards went to men.

### **2006/07 VRQs by Centre Type (See Table 6)**

48% of all recorded VRQ awards were through Further Education/Tertiary Colleges, with a further 19% being through Private Training Providers. Last year these figures were 52% and 18% respectively.

### **2006/07 VRQs by Sector Subject Area (See Table 7)**

19% of all recorded VRQ awards were in 'Information and Communication Technology' (22% last year), 18% were in 'Health, Public Services & Care' (14% last year) and 12% in 'Leisure, Travel & Tourism' (the same as in 2005/06). 41% of all level 1 VRQ awards were in 'Information and Communication Technology' – down from 49% last year, 29% of all Level 2 VRQ awards were in 'Health, Public Services & Care' – up from 20% last year and 18% of all Level 3 VRQ awards were in 'Engineering and Manufacturing

Technologies', the same as last year. At each level the sector subject area with the most awards has remained the same as in 2005/06.

'Health, Public Services and Care' was the largest sector subject area for VRQ awards for women - 24% of all recorded VRQ awards to women were in this subject area. This is a change from last year when 'Information and Communication Technology' was the largest sector subject area. VRQs awarded to men were more evenly spread with 19% of all recorded VRQ awards to men being in 'Engineering & Manufacturing Technologies', 16% in 'Information and Communication Technology' and 14% in 'Leisure, Travel and Tourism' – a slight change from last year when 'Construction, Planning and the Built Environment' was the third largest sector subject area for men.

### **2006/07 Awards of Full VRQs (See Tables 6 and 7)**

Of the 296 thousand awards of full VRQs notified to NISVQ in 2006/07, 157 thousand (53%) were at Level 2 and 99 thousand (34%) were at Level 3. Of the level 2 awards 42% were to those aged 16 and under. By contrast 83% of awards at level 3 were to those aged 17 to 19.

As for all VRQ awards, at all levels more men than women achieved a full VRQ – 67% of such awards at level 2 were achieved by men but at level 3 the difference was less marked with 53% of full VRQ awards being achieved by men.

The majority of awards were through FE and Tertiary Colleges – just over three-quarters. This is true at all levels (91% at level 1, 67% at level 2 and 83% at level 3).

22% of all recorded full VRQ awards were in 'Construction, Planning and the Built Environment', 17% were in 'Health, Public Services & Care', the same percentage as 'Engineering and Manufacturing Technologies'. 24% of all full VRQ awards at level 2 were in 'Construction, Planning and the Built Environment' and 26% of all full VRQ awards at level 3 were in 'Arts, Media and Publishing'.

'Health, Public Services and Care' was the largest sector subject area for full VRQ awards for women - 39% of all recorded full VRQ awards to women were in this subject area. As with all VRQs, full VRQs awarded to men were more evenly spread with 33% of all recorded full VRQ awards to men being in 'Construction, Planning and the Built Environment' and 25% in 'Engineering and Manufacturing Technologies'.

## **NOTES TO EDITORS**

### **SOURCES**

1. The two main sources of information on numbers of awards of vocational qualifications are databases maintained by QCA and DCSF. QCA statistics on the numbers of NVQs awarded are collected from all NVQ awarding bodies. The National Information System for Vocational Qualification (NISVQ) collects candidate level information on awards of all types of QCA-accredited vocational qualifications in the UK currently provided by three of the largest awarding bodies (City and Guilds, EDEXCEL Ltd and OCR, plus information from a further 44 awarding bodies on NVQ, SVQ or VRQ awards at candidate level. Note that NISVQ counts numbers of awards of vocational qualifications not numbers of individuals receiving awards.
2. QCA are responsible for the quality assurance of NVQs i.e. accreditation and monitoring of implementation. QCA accredits proposals by over 100 awarding bodies (which include single bodies and 'joint' awarding body partnerships) to deliver NVQs. The QCA figures are based on aggregate quarterly returns of the numbers of certificates issued, sent to QCA by all NVQ awarding bodies. The awarding bodies' returns cover all certificates issued in the quarter for which payment is due to QCA.
3. The QCA information is the most comprehensive and up to date source of aggregate numbers of NVQs awarded. The numbers can be broken down by NVQ level and QCA Framework Area, which classifies NVQs into one of 11 areas of competence. Awarding Bodies do not provide information about the candidate to QCA but information needs to be available for submission to NISVQ.

### **NVQs/SVQs**

4. As part of the NISVQ project QCA provide DCSF with annual totals (October-September) of NVQ awards by framework area and level. These are provided to QCA by awarding bodies. DCSF use these totals to gross up the more detailed NVQ award information, collected from the awarding bodies that participate in NISVQ, in order to produce UK NVQ estimates. UK NVQ/SVQ estimates are based on grossed-up numbers of NVQs plus all SVQs.
5. Robust UK NVQ/SVQ estimates have been possible over recent years by general increases in the coverage of NVQs on NISVQ, which is measured against the total number of NVQs accredited by QCA in a year. This has been around 95% in each of the recent years and this is largely as a result of the increasing number of awarding bodies submitting NVQ information to NISVQ.

### **VRQs (Vocationally Related Qualifications)**

6. The number of reported VRQs has grown considerably since their inception enabling more detailed analyses to be presented. In 2001/02 NISVQ received information on awards of VRQs from only 3 awarding bodies. Since then the number has increased steadily each year; this year 47 awarding bodies submitted information on awards of VRQs. NISVQ collects information for each award – classified according to the features of the qualifications, e.g. level, subject and occupational group, characteristics of candidates, and the location of the assessment centre. However, the coverage of VRQs on NISVQ is not fully comprehensive.

## Other Accredited Vocational Qualifications

7. For accredited vocational qualifications other than NVQs, SVQs, GNVQs/VCEs, GSVQs and VRQs it is very difficult to establish a complete and accurate picture of the numbers of awards made. Consequently information on other qualifications is not included in this SFR.

## OTHER SOURCES OF INFORMATION

8. The main source for information on people holding/studying for NVQs/SVQs is the Labour Force Survey (LFS).
9. The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is used in this SFR to present information on people holding and working towards NVQs/SVQs broken down by age, gender, economic activity, regions and major occupation groups. Data in this SFR has been re-grossed based on Census 2001 population figures. Minor discrepancies will be present when comparing historic LFS data in this SFR with previous issues of the former bulletin.
10. The LFS is a quarterly sample survey carried out by interviewing people about their personal circumstances and work, and is the biggest regular household survey in this country. Each quarter approximately 150 thousand people are interviewed, living at a representative sample of some 60 thousand addresses throughout the United Kingdom.

## Classification Systems Used in this SFR

11. This SFR has presented information on awards broken down by Sector Subject and Framework Areas. Framework area is only applicable to NVQs and SVQs but, whilst available for all NVQ awards, it is not available for some SVQ awards. Sector Subject area is applicable to all types of vocational qualifications and is available for all VRQ, most NVQ and a few SVQ awards recorded on NISVQ.

## DEFINITIONS

12. **Regulatory Body** - An organisation designated by Parliament to establish national standards for qualifications and to secure compliance with them. QCA regulates all external qualifications in England, and NVQs in Wales and Northern Ireland. QCA works with the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) to ensure that NVQs and SVQs remain aligned.
13. **Academic Age** – Academic Age is the age of the person at the start of the academic year, for example, academic age in 2006/07 would be age at 31 August 2006. Academic age has been used throughout this SFR.
14. **Administering Body** - The organisation that administers an award and therefore holds records of the award. NISVQ collects information on awards administered by a number of awarding bodies and therefore includes joint awards made in collaboration with smaller awarding bodies. This is the definition of administering body used for NISVQ purposes.
15. **Assessment Centre** - An organisation (such as a school, college or workplace) accountable to an awarding body for the assessment arrangements leading to an award, i.e. the centre that assessed, examined or administered the award. This is not necessarily where the training or study took place, or where the candidate is living.
16. **Awarding Body** - An organisation or consortium recognised by a regulatory authority for the purpose of awarding specified qualifications, e.g. an organisation such as City and Guilds which is responsible

for awarding vocational qualifications. Where an awarding body offers an award jointly with another body, it is known as a 'Joint Awarding Body'.

17. **Awards of NVQs** - Only certifications of NVQs are included in QCA and NISVQ information, information on certifications of NVQ units is currently incomplete. Awards of single subjects, mixed level, and client specific qualifications are identified and excluded from the reported NISVQ results. As part of the NISVQ project, a considered judgement of the size of any other qualification that appears in the awarding bodies' data is made by QCA officers who maintain the NISVQ Qualifications file, to identify whether the qualification is a single subject or not. This may include reviewing the content of the qualification, determining the amount of work required, and liaising with the awarding body concerned.
18. **Full Awards of VRQs** – Tables 6 and 7 of this SFR include awards of full VRQs. Full VRQs at levels 1 and 2 have been identified as those which have guided learning for 325 - 504 hours which gives a qualification width of 80-100%. Full VRQs at level 3 have been identified as those which have guided learning for 595 – 774 hours which would also give a qualification width of 80-100%.
19. **NVQ Framework** - The areas of competence within the NVQ framework result from analysis of work roles, and provide the initial organising structure for competence-based qualifications.
20. **NVQ: National Vocational Qualification** - National Vocational Qualifications accredited by QCA are competence-based qualifications built on national occupational standards and criteria established by QCA. The responsibility for developing national occupational standards rests with standards setting bodies - usually National Training Organisations (NTOs) - recognised by a regulatory authority responsible for formulating standards of competence for an employment sector and keeping them under review.
21. **NVQ Level** - One of the five levels in the NVQ Framework. Each competence based full qualification is assigned to just one of these levels. The following definitions of NVQ levels have been taken from QCA's 'Data News'. QCA provide them as a broad measure of the overall demand of a qualification:
  - a. **NVQ Level 1:** competence, which involves the application of knowledge and skills in the performance of a range of varied work activities most of which may be routine and predictable.
  - b. **NVQ Level 2:** competence, which involves the application of knowledge and skills in a significant range of varied work activities, performed in a variety of contexts. Some of the activities are complex or non-routine, and there is some individual responsibility or autonomy. Collaboration with others, perhaps through membership of a work group or team, may often be a requirement.
  - c. **NVQ Level 3:** competence, which involves the application of knowledge and skills in a broad range of varied work activities performed in a wide variety of contexts and most of which are complex and non-routine. There is considerable responsibility and autonomy, and control or guidance of others is often required.
  - d. **NVQ Level 4:** competence, which involves the application of knowledge and skills in a broad range of complex, technical, or professional work activities performed in a wide variety of contexts and with a substantial degree of personal responsibility and autonomy. Responsibility for the work of others and the allocation of resources is often present.
  - e. **NVQ Level 5:** competence, which involves the application of skills and a significant range of fundamental principles and complex techniques across a wide and often unpredictable

variety of contexts. Very substantial personal autonomy and often a significant responsibility for the work of others and for the allocation of substantial resources feature strongly, as do personal accountabilities for analysis and diagnosis, design, planning, execution and evaluation.

22. **Qualification** - In this report, a qualification is a certification that a person has met the required national standards of competence, or practical or theoretical knowledge.
23. **SVQ: Scottish Vocational Qualification** - The Scottish equivalent of an NVQ, accredited by Scottish Qualifications Authority.
24. **SOC: Standard Occupational Classification** - Used to classify the occupational areas of a qualification on the LFS.
25. **Vocationally Related Qualifications (VRQs)** - Vocational qualifications which have been accredited by the Regulatory Authorities for inclusion in the National Qualifications Framework and which therefore meet the relevant criteria for approved qualifications. Accreditation of VRQs commenced in April 2000.
26. **Unit** - An NVQ/SVQ is constructed of units with content expressed as assessable outcomes of learning. A unit is the smallest part of a qualification that can be separately certified.
27. **Vocational Qualification** - A qualification designed to fit a person for employment.
